Red Flags Can Help You Spot Fakes

Just about anything can be counterfeited – movies, handbags, jewelry, perfumes, phones, cameras, batteries, chargers, flashes – even prescriptions, wine, and baby formula.

Electronics are a hot commodity in the counterfeit industry.

Here are some red flags that may indicate a fake power accessory:

- Your battery does not fit easily in your device.
- It's overheating.
- Your battery does not hold a charge.
- Logos are not consistent.



Sure-fire way to protect yourself:

When in doubt, let the manufacturer check it out!
